Founded by an Episcopalian priest, The Rev. Dr. Carlos Plazas, St. Augustine College offers affordable and practical education to a largely Hispanic population. There are now three campuses. The College accommodates the needs of traditional and working students by offering day, evening and Saturday classes.

St. Augustine's is the only institution in the Midwest that offers dual language (Spanish/English) instruction, with classes in all English or Spanish transitioning to English. This reflects the College's commitment to serve the needs of Hispanics and other communities in the Chicago area. Child care services are provided to accommodate the needs of working parents.

We will have a tour of the main campus beginning at 10 AM followed by a short presentation by the 3 young single mothers who have received scholarship support from your ECW in the past 2 years.
